### Minutes & Recommendations of one day Conference held on 15th Match, 2019 at DCPW Hqrs on "Training Requirements of Police Communication"

To assess the training requirements of Police Communication of India, a one day conference was organised by Central Police Radio Training Institute (CPRTI), New Delhi at the Directorate of Coordination Police Wireless Hqrs. on 15th March 2019.

- The Conference was inaugurated by Shri Anand Swaroop, IPS, Director, DCPW. List of representatives of States/UTs, CAPFs, who attended the conference is at Appendix-A
- 3. In his inaugural address, Director, DCPW while greeting the delegates emphasized the importance of communication in Police functioning and highlighted the prominence of DCPW/CPRTI for Police Communication. While discussing the roll of DCPW as SPV for Public Protection & Disaster Relief (PPDR) Network, he urged the assembled delegates to look forward for convergent type reliable and data centric speedy communication system for PPDR requirements. He announced that up gradation of POLNET Network Hub to DVBS-2 Technology is at advance stage and soon DCPW is going to start its regional Training Institutes at Kolkata and Chandigarh and in Bengaluru. He wished the success of conference and envisaged to organise more such conferences of such type in future for the benefit of Stats/UTs Police and CAPFs.
- 4. "Training requirements of Police Communication personnel" were discussed and deliberated organisation wise in 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> session of the Conference under the Chairmanship of Shri Debasish Roy, IPS, ADGP West Bengal Police. Highlights of the discussion are as follows:
  - a. Training programmes on State-of-the-Art Communication systems should be emphasized and topics on cutting-edge communication technologies, equipment and networks etc. Should be incorporated in curriculum of Police Radio Training Institutes.



Central Police Radio Training Institute (CPRTI), New Delhi being the nodal agency on Training for Police Communication, needs to take the lead in this regard.

- b. In view of rapid technological advancement in the field of communication, regular review and updating is essential in training programmes conducted for the Police Communication personnel and such conference should be conducted more often ideally at least once a month or bimonthly.
- c. "Training" shall be prioritised by all PPDRs organisations. DCPW should also consider to upgrade the CPRTI and open the new training Institutes at Regional level to support States/UTs not having their own training Institutes for Police Communication Personnel.
- d. Merging of Technical & Operation cadre into a common cadre. The difficulties being faced by participants were deliberated and discussed in depth. Training requirements of those States/UTs, where two cadres have not been merged, were also discussed and CPRTI is requested to conduct special training programmes preferably for the States/UTs required to train their personnel according to old pattern of Police Wireless Operator (PWO) & Police Wireless Technician (PWT) courses. However a uniform cadre proposal ought to be sent to all states to consider its merits.
- After due discussion on Training requirements projected by Stake holders, the following recommendations were made for implementation and necessary actions to be taken by organisations.
  - I. Syllabus Committee Report-2013 (SCR-2013) to be reviewed to incorporate the latest communication systems, network technology and techniques in the syllabus and to modify the pattern required as per the feedback of stakeholders. A New Syllabus Committee to be constituted.

(Action by DCPW/CPRTI)



II. CPRTI, New Delhi shall focus on conducting training Programmes on Advance Communication technologies and Modern Systems. The Basic courses may be conducted at the State level Training Institutes and for the States/UTs not having their own training States, the Basic courses may be conducted at Regional Police Wireless Institutes (RPWTIs) of DCPW.

(Action by DCPW/CPRTI)

III. Short duration Training programmes (2 to 3 days) for Senior Police officers may be conducted on latest trends & Technologies in the field of ICT like Cyber Security, Satellite based communication systems, drone technology etc. in collaboration with IITs and other pioneer agencies or by inviting experts from such agencies.

(Action by CPRTI)

IV. CPRTI, New Delhi may develop a Web Portal like NPTEL, OCW MIT for online courses and facilities.

(Action by CPRTI)

V. Special batches of PWT/PWO courses may be conducted for State Police as per their requirements. States/UTs shall furnish their requirement to CPRTI.

(Action by CPRTI/States/UTs)

On Specialized Topics, a panel of experts/resource person VI. Serving/Retired personnel fromStates/UTs/CAPFs, other pioneer Govt. agencies and PSU/Private Firms may be developed at CPRTI, New Delhi and may be shared with all stake holders for training purpose. States/ UTs/CAPFs shall forward the detail of such resource persons to CPRTI.

(Action by CPRTI/States/UTs/CAPFs)

CPRTI may tie up with premier Govt., Public and private VII. Institutions like IITs, DoT, DRDO, SAG, JCB, ISRO, BEL, CDAC, Cert-In, NIC, CISCO, Ericson, RAILTEL, Samsung, Motorola etc. to conduct short duration high end Specialised training programs/Workshop for Police communication Personnel.

(Action by CPRTI)

VIII. State Police organisations should take up the case with their respective Govt. for grant of "Training Allowances" to the officials deployed for instructional duties at their Training Institutes, as admissible to the Central Training Institute's official, as per the DopT O.M/ guidelines issued time to time.

(Action by States)

The Conference concluded with thanks to the Chair followed by National Anthem.
